



Fall is the time to cut plumes from Pampas grass

- Cut them off in early fall, before seeds set.
- Or bag them up and throw them away so seeds don't spread.
- If you can, remove the plants entirely.
- Make it fun! Organize a removal party on your street.

Help keep habitats intact

Bald eagles depend on intact habitats to hunt and scavenge for food. The biodiversity of these habitats is threatened when invasive plants like Pampas grass are allowed to take over.



Pampas grass can increase fire danger, reduce soil stability and create inhospitable habitat for native plants, animals, insects and fungi.
