##### **Online Crime Report:**

The following must all be true to your situation to file an online crime report:

- This is not an emergency.
- This incident occurred within the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office jurisdiction.
- There are no known suspects.
- This did not occur on a State Freeway.

Non-emergency crimes can also be reported over the phone by calling (707) 445-7251.

A crime tip form is not meant to report crime in which you are the victim or emergencies. Please give as much detail as possible when submitting your crime tip.

Crime tips can also be submitted over the phone by calling the Sheriff's Crime Tip Hotline at (707) 268-2539. This hotline is a secure voicemail system that is checked every day.

#### **Free Firewood Available:**

Our crews have been busy this spring clearing easements and roadways and have left free piles of recently cut logs adjacent the airport on Upper Pacific Drive just north of the clubhouse. Please help yourself and be safe.

#### **Annual Recycled Irrigation Water Notice:**

Shortly, the night-time irrigation of the golf links will resume using recycled water from our wastewater treatment plant. Irrigation sprinklers are not usually activated until after dark, and people should avoid areas that are actively being sprinkled. This water is safe for irrigation, but not for drinking.

#### **Celebrate Earth Day with Stewardship & Fun**

Come celebrate Earth Day by joining the Pioneers at the Clubhouse on Upper Pacific Drive on **Saturday, April 23rd** from 9:30 a.m. to approximately 1 p.m. for a pancake breakfast to benefit the Lighthouse followed by a community cleanup. Alternatively, you can help steward our local public lands by joining Friends of the Lost Coast and BLM King Range National Conservation Area at 10 a.m. at Mal Coombs Park, located at 1176 Lower Pacific Drive. Come experience the fun, the satisfaction of service work, and enjoy a free lunch for volunteers. Service projects take place at Mal Coombs Park, Abalone Point and Black Sands Beach and include weeding of native plant gardens, removal of ice-plant, fennel, and other invasive species, spreading of native wildflower seeds and more. After breaking into three volunteer teams to work each project site, the day culminates back at Mal Coombs Park with free lunch for volunteers and Earth Day merriment. Tools and gloves are provided. California and our North Coast region are currently in a state of severe drought. The District wants to encourage all Shelter Cove residents and businesses to take action now to help reduce water use later this summer and fall. Consider planting your vegetable garden earlier this year and finishing out your harvest before late summer when water flows will be at their lowest. Consider drought tolerant plants when choosing new plants for your garden. Small actions by many can be very effective in counteracting the drought.
