NOVEMBER ELECTION

California's statewide general election will be on Tuesday November 8th. Registered voters within our District will be able to cast their votes for two open (4-year term) Board Director seats. You can contact Humboldt County's Office of Elections at 707-445-7481 for information on how to register. All voting in our area is completed by using mail-in ballots. There is no local polling station. The following candidates have registered to run for the two open Board Director seats: Phillip Young, Jack Hargrave, and Mike Soluri.

Local civic group, Shelter Cove Pioneers, will be hosting a Meet the Candidates Event on Sunday, October 16th starting at 3:30 pm at the Community Clubhouse at 1555 Upper Pacific Drive. This is an opportunity for community members to meet and talk with candidates running for Board Director seats in the upcoming election. This event is free and open to the public. All are welcome to attend.

GRAFFITI (REWARD)

In recent months numerous District and public recreation sites have been vandalized with graffiti. The District is offering a reward of \$250 to an individual who can provide factual information that identifies the responsible party. Please contact the District office if you think you can help.



GRANT AWARD

The District is excited to share that it is the recipient of a \$324,000 Wildfire Resilience Grant awarded by the State Coastal Conservancy. These funds will be used to support continued tree/limb/brush removal along roadways in Shelter Cove and also to purchase additional heavy equipment to support our Chipper Days program and planned fuel reduction/forest health work on District greenbelt.
