Jack Hargrave 221 votes

Michael Soluri 174 votes

Phillip Young 110 votes

Congratulations to the top two board candidates who will fill the four-year term positions. Thanks to all the candidates for taking the time to participate in the election and for being willing to serve our community.

Applications for the RID board seat vacated by Director, Celeste Myers were considered by the Humboldt County Board of Supervisors at their November 29, 2022, meeting. The Board of Supervisors unanimously voted to appoint Janet Evans to fill the remainder of this board seat term until December 6th, 2024.

These three new Directors will participate in a ceremonial swearing-in at the December 15th, 2022, regular board meeting at 9 AM.

BURNING

The following information is provided by Cal Fire.

How to Safely Burn Landscape Debris:

- Landscape debris piles must be in small 4 feet by 4 feet piles for Standard Burn Permits.
- Maximum pile size is 4 feet in diameter.
- Clear all flammable material and vegetation within 10 feet of the outer edge of pile.
- Keep a water supply and shovel close to the burning site.
- A responsible adult is required by law to be in attendance until the fire is out.
- No burning shall be undertaken unless weather conditions (particularly wind) are such that burning can be considered safe.

What can be burned?

Dry, natural vegetation, grown on the property can still be burned outdoors in open piles.

No household trash or garbage can be burned outdoors at residences.

BURN PERMITS

You can obtain an Air Quality Management District burn permit by picking one up at the Fire Station/District Office. Completed applications and fee must be sent to the AQMD office at 707 L St. Eureka, CA 95501. They will mail you your permit. You can also apply online at <http://wv.w.ncuaqmd.org> for a faster turnaround.

Burn Day info is available by calling 1-866-BURN-DAY. Shelter Cove is Zone #1. Please have your permit on site while burning.

BE READY FOR WINTER DRIVING CONDITIONS

Be prepared for winter driving conditions. Carry food, water, and blankets in your vehicle. If there are road

conditions needing repair in your neighborhood, call **Humboldt County Public Works directly at 445-7421** and the repair request will be logged. Early reporting can stop damage from becoming more serious.
