SIRENS? WHAT TO DO!

If you hear a 3-minute steady tone - There might be a Tsunami. Head to higher ground if you are in the tsunami zone.

If you hear a 3-minute fast hi low - There is a fire with an immediate life or property threat, and you must evacuate down a safe route to the Clubhouse where the SC-CERT team will set up an emergency shelter.

If you hear a voice prompt- Please listen to the commands.

If you hear a onetime low “growl” at noon- This is the daily diagnostic test, and no action should be taken.
