JUNE DISTRICT BOARD MEETING

ANNUAL UTILITY RATE INCREASES

By action of the Board, annual utility rate increases resumed on <u>July 1st, 2021</u>. Yearly increases for water (3%) and sewer (10%) will continue until 2025 and electric increases (3%) will continue until 2024. Water and sewer rate adjustments were originally delayed for one year in 2020 by Board action due to the pandemic. This yearly utility rate increase goes into effect on July 1, 2023 to be reflected on the August bill.

LET SLEEPING FAWNS LIE



What should you do if you find a fawn alone? The short answer? Nothing!

It's perfectly normal for a mother deer (doe) to leave her baby for many hours at a time. **Handling a fawn decreases its chance of survival.** The longer you and your human scent are around the fawn, the more vulnerable to predators they become. **Deer are instinctively terrified of humans.** Putting a fawn in a stressful situation by picking it up, petting it, etc., can cause physical distress which can even kill them. **Attempting to "rescue" a baby deer** on your own without contacting a licensed wildlife rehabilitator is illegal.

While a fawn's mother is nearby most of the time, here are some signs that the fawn may need help:

- The deer is in a dangerous spot, near a busy road.
- You can see clear signs of injury.
- The baby deer is calling out continually.
- You can spot a dead doe nearby.
