TIDAL STUDY



On September 6th and 7th, 2023, a tidal dye study was performed of the ocean outfall from the Wastewater Treatment Plant. The study was undertaken by J2Environmental along with RID staff and CERT and SCFD assistants "fishing" for water samples. The dye was eco- friendly and biodegradable and turned areas of ocean water a red color for a short time. This study was done to maintain our National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit.
