BEACH & HIGH SURF ADVISORY



Large breaking waves generated by winter storms may create hazardous conditions along our coastline this time of year. Large, unexpected waves can sweep across the beach without warning, sweeping people into the sea from rocks, jetties, and beaches. These sneaker waves can move large objects such as logs, crushing anyone caught underneath. Don't be fooled by an ocean that looks calm. There can be 30 minutes of small waves before a sneaker wave strikes. Avoid rocks and jetties. Avoid steep beaches. Stay back from the water and never turn your back on the ocean.

WINTER DRIVING

With torrential rains, high winds and snow, navigating our steep, windy roads can be a challenge. Please stay informed of current road conditions. When storms are raging, please only drive if necessary. Prepare an emergency kit, carry blankets, water and non-perishable snacks. Drive slowly on slick or snow-covered surfaces and when going downhill, downshift to a lower gear. Accelerate and decelerate slowly. Increase your follow distance to allow time to stop. Steer into a skid. Be alert and well-rested when getting behind the wheel and always wear your seat belt. If you encounter any roadblocks, like rockslides or downed trees, please call 911.

BURN PERMITS

Even with winter weather, you need a permit from North Coast Air Quality Management District to legally burn in Shelter Cove.

Annual permits run from January to December, take a week to process and applications are available at the Fire Station/District office. Completed applications and the residential burn permit fee must be sent to the AQMD office at 707 L Street, Eureka, CA 95501.

For a quicker turnaround you may **apply online** at https://www.ncuaqmd.org/ Your permit will be emailed to you.

Burn day information for Shelter Cove (Zone 1) is available each day by calling 1-866-BURN-DAY. Please have your permit on-site while burning.

TRASH DISPOSAL

Although the district is not responsible for the waste disposal site in Shelter Cove, the RID often receives inquiries regarding its hours of operation. The site is located on Telegraph Creek Road and is open 9 a.m. until noon on Wednesday, Thursday, Saturday, and Sunday. For further information please call Recology Eel River: 707-725-5156.
