MARINE MAMMAL MONITORING



Do you enjoy walking Shelter Cove's beaches? Are you interested in contributing to the conservation of local marine mammals? Then you're invited to join Friends of the Lost Coast, BLM and Dr. Dawn Goley, Director of Cal Poly Humboldt's Stranded Marine Mammal Monitoring Program, for a **lecture** by Dr. Goley on Friday, April 26th from 5:30 to 6:30pm and **volunteer training** on Saturday, April 27th, from 9:30am to 1:30pm at the Shelter Cove Community Clubhouse. The training will include a field outing.

TREE MAINTENANCE

The District asks that our customers please do not plant trees or other vegetation in public utility easements. Trimming and maintaining existing trees and keeping them away from power lines is the responsibility of the property owner. However, if Resort Improvement District staff make the determination that a tree is a danger to existing utility infrastructure or becomes a safety issue, it can be removed at any time by District staff. <u>CAREER OPPORTUNITIES</u> Water/Wastewater Treatment Plant Operator:

Must possess valid Water/Wastewater Treatment Plant Operator Certificates issued by California SWRCB. Must possess a valid California Driver's License.

Position is responsible for water and wastewater treatment plant operations, including the formulation and implementation of treatment plant operation methods.

Journeyman, Power Distribution:

Salary Range: \$57.07 to \$61.46 negotiable depending on experience.

Under general supervision, perform experienced level work in the construction and maintenance of overhead and underground electrical lines and electrical distribution system, and perform related duties.

Minimum Requirements:

Must have completed high school or its equivalent. Must have completed an accredited 4-year apprenticeship program and have 4 years Journeyman line experience. Must possess a valid California Driver's License.
